Progression in the Associate Degree Nursing program is contingent in part upon achievement of a grade of C or greater in all nursing program prerequisite courses and nursing curriculum courses and maintenance of a 2.0 cumulative grade point average or above (on a 4.0 scale), in addition to all other requirements noted in the Associate Degree Nursing Program Student Handbook.

Miscellaneous Information: Applicants for the Associate Degree Nursing program are ranked on a point system based on two criteria: Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS), and Math and Science coursework. Acceptance into the program will be based on rank order. In order to be considered for admission, applicants must comply with college and program admission requirements. Applications will be available at www.gateway.kctcs.edu in the fall semester for spring admission. Progression in the Associate Degree Nursing program is contingent upon achievement of a grade of C or greater in all nursing program prerequisite courses and nursing curriculum courses and maintenance of a 2.0 cumulative grade point average or better (on a 4.0 scale). Graduates are eligible to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN). A criminal background check and drug test are required for enrollment and participation in the ADN Program. The expense must be borne by the student.

Students entering the Associate Degree Nursing program must have successfully completed a 75-hour Nursing Assistant course and be active on the Kentucky Nurse Aide Registry by the admission cycle deadline (as noted on the admission application).

Any biological sciences coursework completed before acceptance into the nursing program must have been completed with a grade of C or greater within the five (5) year period prior to application to the program.

Applicants who have previously been admitted to another nursing program, and who have earned a failing grade (D, E, F, WF) in a nursing course or program may not be accepted for admission to the GCTC Nursing Program.

<u>Note</u>: The Kentucky Board of Nursing may deny admission to the NCLEX-RN Exam if an individual has been convicted of a misdemeanor or felony which involves acts that bear directly on the qualifications of the graduate to practice nursing.
